Minutes from the Annual Business Meeting and Social

November 19, 2023

Following a time of socialization and delightful treats, President Fred Anderson called the meeting to order at 3:23 p.m. President Anderson welcomed everyone and thanked them for attending.

Three items were on the agenda for the meeting:

- 1. The Hosta Society has surplus funds which should be dispersed. It was suggested that the area public gardens that do not require an entrance fee should receive donations. The current bank balance is \$2,728.68. Last year, the following disbursements were given:

- 2. If the Society kept the same amounts to be donated in 2023, that would leave a bank Balance of \$228.68. Mary Albrecht also mentioned that 2024 dues would be collected soon. Janie Bitner moved that the Society keep the same donations for 2023. Maria Gall seconded the motion. Members voted and the motion passed.
- 3. Nominations of 2024 officers was the next agenda item. Fred will be leaving the USA for Australia mid-year and offered to continue until then. However, if no one offers to become president, the club will be without leadership. He asked for members to


